

Are Birthdays Lawful?

Jer 10:1

Hear ye the word which AHAYAH speaketh unto you, O house of Israel:

Jer 10:2

Thus saith AHAYAH, Learn not the way of the heathen, and be not dismayed at the signs of heaven; for the heathen are dismayed at them.

Jer 10:3

For the customs of the people are vain: for one cutteth a tree out of the forest, the work of the hands of the workman, with the axe.

Psa 96:5

For all the alahayims of the nations are idols: but AHAYAH made the heavens.

Jer 10:8

But they are altogether brutish and foolish: the stock is a doctrine of vanities.

Sir 17:17

For in the division of the nations of the whole earth he set a ruler over every people; but Israel is AHAYAH's portion:

Jub 15:30

H3117 יוֹם Yom

From an unused root meaning to be hot; a day (as the warm hours), whether literally (from sunrise to sunset, or from one sunset to the next), or figuratively (a space of time defined by an associated term), (often used adverbially): - age, + always, + chronicles, continually (-ance), daily, ([birth-], each, to) day, (now a, two) days (agone), + elder, X end, + evening, + (for) ever (-lasting, -more), X full, life, as (so) long as (...live), (even) now, + old, + outlived, + perpetually, presently, + remaineth, X required, season, X since, space, then, (process of) time, + as at other times, + in trouble, weather, (as) when, (a, the, within a) while (that), X whole (+ age), (full) year (-ly), + younger.

But as he which hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; 1Pe 1:16




So then they that are in the flesh cannot please Alahayim.

- 11. New Moon of the 10th month (Winter)

- 13. New moon of the 1st month (Spring)

Banquets when a child is weaned: Abraham made a banquet on the day his son was weaned, not in celebration of the day of his birth. It was a miracle to the inhabitants of the land due to Abraham & Sarah's old age and all the people came to feast and rejoice with them rejoicing at the news that they were given a son.

Gen 21:8

And the child grew, and was weaned: and Abraham made a great feast the same day that Isaac was weaned.

Jasher 21:5.

And Shem and Eber and all the great people of the land, and Abimelech king of the Philistines, and his servants, and Phicol, the captain of his host, came to eat and drink and rejoice at the feast which Abraham made upon the day of his son Isaac's being weaned.

Jasher 21:6.



Feasts of thanksgiving for deliverance: The Man made a feast in thanksgiving for his son being returned home unto him.

Luk 15:21

And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son.

Luk 15:22

But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet:

Luk 15:23

And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry: Luk 15:24

For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry. Luk 15:25

There is an	affinity of such commemoration among the wicked as recorded in The
Satanic Bib	ole (Anton LaVey, (Air) Book of Lucifer – The Enlightenment, Avon Books,
1969, Ch X	I, Religious Holidays, p. 96) regarding Birthdays:

"The highest of all holidays in the Satanic religion is the date of one's own birthday. This is in direct contradiction to the holy of holy days of other religions, which deify a



particular deity who has been created in an anthropomorphic form of their own image, thereby showing that the ego is not really buried. The Satanist feels: 'Why not really be honest and if you are going to create a deity in your image, why not create that deity as yourself." Every man is a deity if he chooses to recognize himself as one. So, the Satanist celebrates his own birthday as the most important holiday of the year. After all, aren't you happier about the fact that you were born than you are about the birth of someone you have never even met? Origen of Alexandria, writing over two centuries after the death of Yache follows this same line when he recorded a diatribe against the memories of birthdays, indicating that at the time of his writing, a day to remember the birth of Yache was not part of the church calendar. In his Homilies on Leviticus, speaking on the aspect of birth, Origen states:

... not one from all the saints is found to have celebrated a festive day or a great feast on the day of his birth. No one is found to have had joy on the day of the birth of his son or daughter. Only sinners rejoice over this kind of birthday. For indeed we find in the Old Testament Pharaoh, king of Egypt, celebrating the day of his birth with a festival, and in the New Testament, Herod. However both of them stained the festival of his birth by shedding human blood.... But the saints not only do not celebrate a festival on their birth days, but, filled with the Holy Spirit, they curse that day (, after the example of Job, Jeremiah and David).

What is the origin of birthday celebrations?

Birthday celebrations are actually rooted in paganism.

Encyclopedia Americana (1991) states:

"The ancient world of Egypt, Greece, Rome, and Persia celebrated the birthdays of deities, kings, and nobles."

Authors Ralph and Adelin Linton reveal the underlying reason for this. In their book The Lore of Birthdays, they write:

"Mesopotamia and Egypt, the cradles of civilization, were also the first lands in which men remembered and honoured their birthdays. The keeping of birthday records was important in ancient times principally because a birth date was essential for the casting of a horoscope."

So, there is a direct connection between the Pagan practice of birthday celebrations and astrology (horoscopes and fortune telling).

Not surprisingly then, the ancient Jews did not celebrate birthdays, regarding them as Pagan.


Also, World Book Encyclopedia (3:416) states:

"The early Christians did not celebrate His [Christ's] birth because they considered the celebration of anyone's birth to be a pagan custom."

To satiate this point, notice also the record of the first century historian Josephus: The Jews in Christ's day knew Alahayim's attitude toward birthday celebrations, "*Nay*, *indeed*, *the law does not permit us to make festivals at the births of our children*" (Josephus, Against Apion, II:26).
