Pt. 2: History & Characteristics of the Jews

Est 8:9

Then were the king's scribes called at that time in the third month, that *is*, the month Sivan, on the three and twentieth *day* thereof; and it was written according to all that Mordecai commanded unto the Jews, and to the lieutenants, and the deputies and rulers of the provinces which *are* from India unto Ethiopia, an **hundred** twenty and seven provinces, unto every province according to the writing thereof, and unto every people after their language, and to the Jews according to their writing, and according to their language.

Luk 21:24

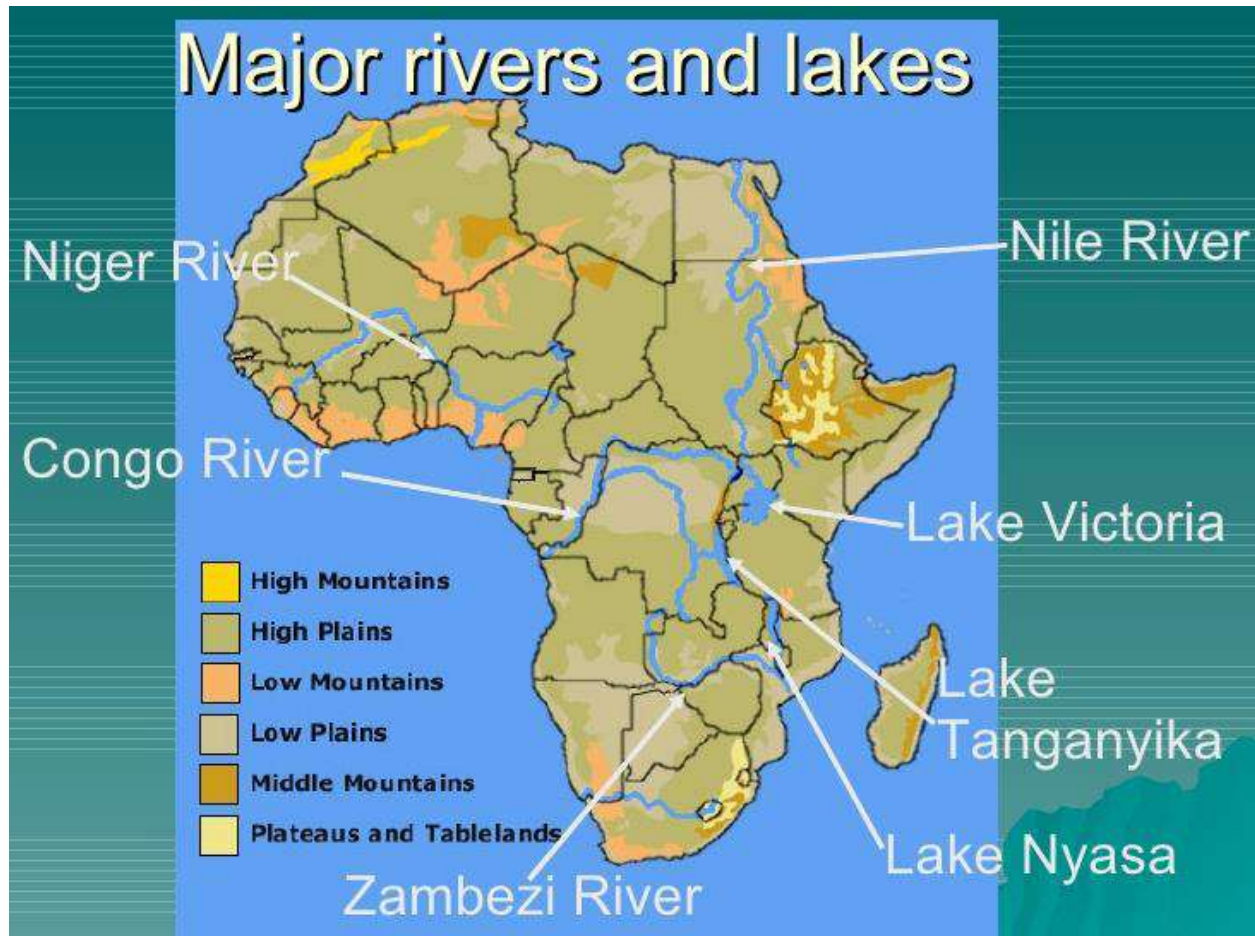

חַיִּי

From an unused root meaning to *be warm*, that is, (by implication) *sunburnt* or *swarthy* (blackish): - brown.

H3568

כּוּשׁ

BDB Definition:

Cush = “black”

Jer 13:23

Can the Ethiopian change his skin, or the leopard his spots? *then* may ye also do good, that are accustomed to do evil.

Αἰθίοψ

Aithiops

From αἶϑω aithō (to *scorch*) and ὤψ ops (the *face*, from G3700); an *Ethiopian* (as a *blackamoor*): - Ethiopian.

Thayer Definition:



Ethiopian = “black”

Act 21:37

And as Paul was to be led into the castle, he said unto the chief captain, May I speak unto thee? Who said, Canst thou speak Greek?

Act 21:38

Art not thou that Egyptian, which before these days madest an uproar, and leddest out into the wilderness four thousand men that were murderers?

Act 21:39

But Paul said, I am a man *which am* a **Jew** of Tarsus, *a city* in Cilicia, a citizen of no mean city: and, I beseech thee, suffer me to speak unto the people.

Job 30:30

My skin is black upon me, and my bones are burned with heat.

Son 1:5

I *am* black, but comely, O ye daughters of Jerusalem, as the tents of Kedar, as the curtains of Solomon.

Son 1:6

Look not upon me, because I *am* black, because the sun hath looked upon me: my mother's children were angry with me; they made me the keeper of the vineyards; *but* mine own vineyard have I not kept.

Esther (15:5)

And she was ruddy through the perfection of her beauty, and her countenance was cheerful and very amiable: but her heart was in anguish for fear.

1Sa 17:42

And when the Philistine looked about, and saw David, he disdained him: for he was *but* a youth, and ruddy, H132 and of a fair countenance.

H132

אֲדָמוֹנִי אֲדָמוֹנִי

From H119; reddish (of the hair or the complexion): - red, ruddy.
